OVERVIEW

This guide provides parents with a general overview of the designated supports that are available for use on the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) and the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS). Designated supports are accommodations that change the way a student accesses an assessment, without changing the content being assessed. This guide provides an overview of the designated supports that can be approved by the appropriate team at a student's school and should not be independently used to make assessment decisions for students.
